

CITY OF HOLLADAY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

BENEFITS TO THE CITY OF HOLLADAY:

1. Support for Education creates a stronger community. Good schools make good neighborhoods. The quality of schools has a direct correlation with the vibrancy of our residential community.
2. Return to the Community. It has been shown that individuals who succeed in their academic pursuits and give back to their community through service provide an intangible benefit to the city. Encouraging post high school education will result in greater community involvement and a reduction in the crime rate.
3. Goodwill and an improved relationship with Granite School District.
 - (a) The cooperative spirit between the city and the district for the use of facilities and participation in mutual programs such as you city council, cannot be measured in a monetary manner.
 - (b) Support of Granite School District is necessary for the long-term successes of the City's redevelopment projects. An increasing and volume property tax lease benefits both the district and the city.
4. Quality education and good students result in good citizens. Statistically it has been shown that there is a direct correlation between the level of education the citizens of a community have, local crime level and number of good neighborhoods.

PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM: to recognize the achievements of students who have shown excellence in leadership, significant community involvement and academic success.

SCOPE OF PROGRAM: Annually the city will award six (6) general purpose scholarships to one male and one female student from each of the high schools that generally serve the city. These schools are Cottonwood, Skyline and Olympus High School. The amount of the scholarship will be determined during each budget deliberation session. It is projected to be \$500.00 per student.

CRITERIA FOR AWARDING OF SCHOLARSHIP:

The following guidelines shall be used in awarding the scholarships:

1. Preference shall be given to student residents of the City of Holladay.
2. Award must be used for post high school education. The award is not necessarily restricted to individuals who attend a traditional college or university.

3. Award must be based on academic achievement, leadership displayed and service to the school or community.
4. The award is a secondary award. The award is intended to be awarded to individuals who generally do not have other significant monetary awards.
5. The award will be given on a reimbursement basis. Proof of payment for tuition, books, etc. and proof of enrollment will be required prior to reimbursement.

The decision to award the scholarships shall be made by a committee of not less than three (3) administrators at each school after an application process has been completed.
